	NEGATIVE	There isn't a cat on the roof. There isn't an orange in the kitchen. There isn't any milk in the fridge.
	INTERROGATIVE	Is there a cat on the roof? Yes, there is. Is there an orange in the kitchen? No, there isn't. Is there any milk in the fridge? Yes, there is.

PLURAL NOUNS	AFFIRMATIVE	There are three cats on the roof. There are some students in class.
	NEGATIVE	There aren't three cats on the roof. There aren't any students in class.
	INTERROGATIVE	Are there three cats on the roof? No, there aren't. Are there any students in class? Yes, there are.
